

## Final Exam Reading List

The following lists contain the selections of texts that will be available as **PASSAGE IDs** for the Final Exam. You are more than welcome to use the passages that we read that are on the “excluded” or “optional” lists in your responses to other questions (e.g., as a connection to another ID, as part of a SHORT ID response, or in your essay), but you will not be expected to identify those passages in Part A of the Final. I would recommend you skim through your notes on the “eliminated” texts just to recall what they say as you will probably find the examples therein useful for your IDs and (especially) the Essay.

**From the second half of the Class** (i.e., since the Midterm):

**ALL MATERIAL** since the Midterm is open for PASSAGE IDs! A good proportion of the passages will come from this most recent material: review it carefully!
