

### Verb Synopses – 506 Version

A **verb synopsis** compares the forms of a verb for a given PERSON and NUMBER across all TENSES, VOICES, and MOODS. (After you learn the Subjunctive mood, that will be added to synopses too, but for now focus on the indicative mood). Building a verb synopsis essentially asks you to do the opposite of a Verb Conjugation box, which gives you TMV and asks you to conjugate the verb in every person and number. Since a synopsis puts all the verbal forms of a given person and number in one place—in fact, synopsis is from the Greek word for “seeing everything in one view”—making synopses is a great way to review the formation of verbs!

Pick a **verb** (list the 4 principal parts below) and a **person** and **number** to build the synopsis:
